

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Persons appointed to this position must work effectively with limited supervision.

Persons appointed to this position may be required to work overtime to ensure that projects are completed on time.

May be required to assist equipment operators and/or operate and maintain crew boats or other small watercraft at specific sites.

Persons appointed to the Used Oil Program option are required to satisfactorily complete inspector certification training provided by Maryland Department of the Environment, within 6 months of beginning employment with the Service.

Runs errands to pick up parts and supplies for the facility.

Performs other work-related duties as assigned.

SUPERVISORY REQUIREMENTS

This job has no supervisory responsibilities.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Graduation from a standard high school or GED plus one year of work experience related to the option for which application is made.

Note: Applicants may substitute 2 years of related education beyond HS level for required work experience.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Must be able to pass standard physical exam.

Ability to learn the principles and practices applicable to the assigned option and ability to make correct determinations based on observation of those technical procedures and practices.

Ability to follow instructions under minimal supervision.

Must be able to communicate effectively, verbally and in writing and be able to follow verbal and written instructions.

Note: Persons appointed to the Oil Control Program are required to satisfactorily participate in specialized training from the Maryland Department of the Environment to obtain inspector certification. Failure to obtain UST certification within 6 months of employment will be cause for termination.

Ability to operate personal computers using word processing and spreadsheet software.

Must be able to lift 50 pounds.

LICENSES, CERTIFICATIONS

Possession of a valid driver's license meeting the requirements of Maryland law, the MES Fleet Policy and other MES Policies.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to stand and walk. Must use hands and arms to handle equipment, and document and maintain records. Required to stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl to service equipment, and site structures. May be required to ascend and descend ladders.

Must be able to wear protective equipment such as safety harnesses, coveralls, gloves, goggles, respirators, steel toe safety shoes, and hearing protection.

Must be able to talk and hear.

Appointment to some sites may require confined space entry. A confined space is large enough that an employee can bodily enter and perform assigned tasks, but has limited or restricted means for entry or exit and is not designed for continuous employee occupancy. These areas could include tanks, manholes, silos, pits, vaults, spillways, vessels, etc., and have the possibility to contain an atmospheric hazard. Employees working at these types of facilities will be required to enter and perform the work involved with confined spaces, and will be required to adhere to all safety procedures and participate in trainings associated with confined space entry.

Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, peripheral vision, night vision, depth perception and ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly exposed to outdoor weather conditions including cold, heat, wind, rain, snow, mud, ice and dust, and may require travel to work by boat.

The noise level in the work environment is moderate to loud and could require the use of hearing protection.
