The Director advised the Board of discussions with representatives from the Chase Manhattan Bank regarding operation of facilities that currently serve the community of Ocean Pines, Maryland

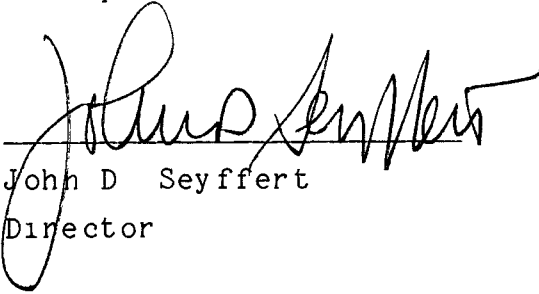

5 KMS Development - Negotiations have been suspended

6 Prince George's Methane Project - The Service will hire the necessary staff shortly Protocol problems have been resolved

7 Waste Oil - EPA appears not to be inclined to include waste oil as a regulated waste The Chief of Technical Services, Dr Willey, is gathering information from waste oil collectors in order to aid the Service in developing a State strategy on the issue

9 Hart-Miller Island - Budget fights are expected Money is urgently needed for deferred crust management activities A bio-monitoring protocol has been completed The efficacy of the project depends upon many variables, the dominant one being the rate at which the Corps of Engineers decides to pursue dredging operations Increasing the Island's containment wall elevations is being considered, and the FY 1988 Budget Request contains an increase

The Deputy Director reported as follows

1 BCRRF Availability of the Crane Station boiler is not as consistent as MES would like Use of RDF reduces the kilowatt rating of the generating unit This translates to lost money for Baltimore Gas & Electric In response to a question from Director Barnes, Mr Scibinico advised that he anticipates no difficulty in meeting bond obligations, and that the bonds should be paid off by June of 1988

2 Dorsey Run Construction is on schedule The plant should be operational in the Spring The Service is taking no position in the negotiations between the Department of General Services and the KMS Group

3 Smith Island. An emissions test for the incinerator is scheduled for the week of October 6th. The Sanitary Commission has been advised that pumps at the wastewater plant should be repaired. The Operations and Maintenance Division is considering the need to designate a new Regional Supervisor for Eastern Shore Facilities.

4 Dickerson Leaf Composting  
Operations are proceeding well.

5 Compost The District of Columbia has asked the Service to sell its compost until the District requests bids for a long-term marketing agent. The Service counteroffered to sell the compost as ComPRO<sub>R</sub> until December 31, 1986 if (1) the District approves the Service's budget, (2) the compost meets the Service's standards, and (3) a trademark license fee is paid. The license is to expire December 31, 1986.

**MES FINANCIAL MATTERS**

1 The Director advised that the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources has approved the Program Development Procedures.

2 No Program Development Fund expenditures were reported, but the Chief of Administration advised that some reproduction costs for the Allegany County Proposal would be charged to the Fund.


3 The Deputy Director stated that the Annual Audit would be available soon.

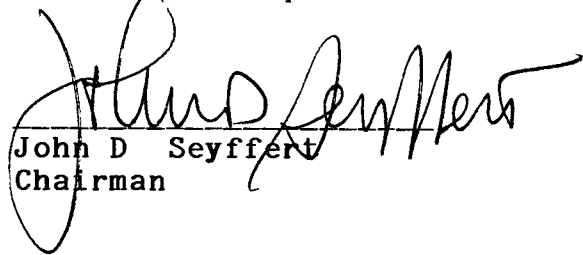
