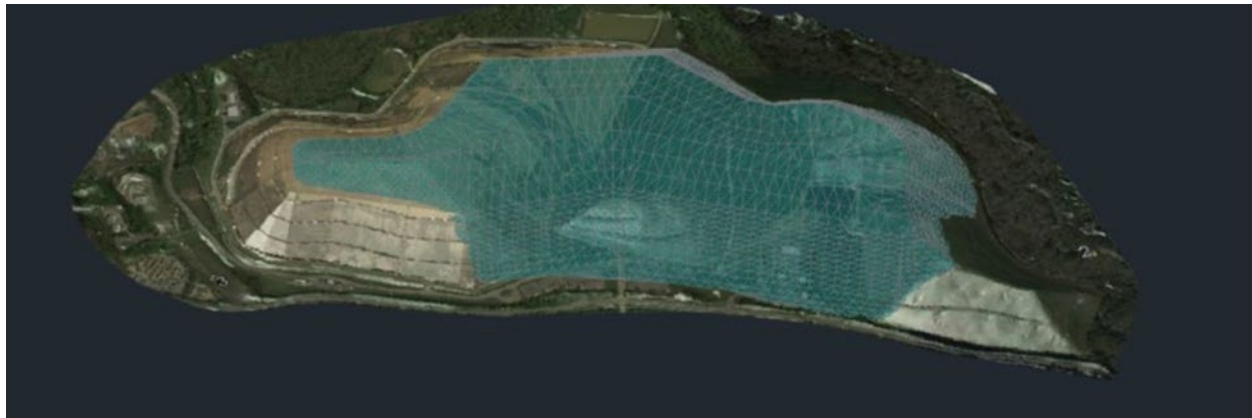
The Brown Station Road Sanitary Landfill (BSRSL) is a municipal solid waste landfill owned and operated by Prince George’s County (County). The landfill encompasses 850 acres and is divided into two primary areas: Area A and B. Area A is closed and approximately 148 acres in size. Area B is active and has been operational since 1992 encompassing approximately 140 acres. The current landfill is expected to reach its final permitted capacity near the end of Year 2025. To meet the County’s municipal solid waste management needs beyond 2025, the County is currently in the process of obtaining a Refuse Disposal Permit to infill the air space between the existing landfill disposal areas A and B (referred to as Area C). The MDE permitting process

consist of 5 phases: Phase I - Preliminary Information, Phase II – Geological and Hydrological Report, Phase III – Engineering Report, Phase IV – Internal Review and Preparation, and Phase V – Public Comment. The County initiated work on MDE’s Refuse Disposal Permit efforts with SCS Engineers in 2019. To date, SCS has completed Phase I and II and is presently working on Phase III. Under this contract, SCS will complete permitting and design by May 2023. Construction of the new cell will be publicly advertised in early 2023. SCS will provide engineering support through construction from May 2023 through January 2025.

To prepare the landfill for the new cells, SCS will complete the design and construction of critical infrastructure required for the completion of Area C. This includes:

- Upgrades / Enhancements to the BSRSL Scale house. Including multiple incoming/outgoing traffic lanes designated for specific waste-type arrivals, high-tech handling of arrival tonnages, management of payment and accounts without exiting their vehicle (by use of a numeric keypad), and speedy transactions in and out.
- Relocation of residential disposal lots from the landfill side of Brown Station Road to the opposite side of Brown Station Road.
- Replacement/relocation of the South Leg Leachate Pumping Station and associated force main pipelines.
- Relocation of Flare station to accommodate relocated landfill gas pipelines and the existing flaring complex.

All operational changes must be addressed before commissioning Area C Cell #1 (January 2025).

Prince George's County staff accepts HHW and other streams Monday – Wednesday at the regular homeowner drop off facility and transport it to the HHW facility for processing. Material streams collected at this location include HHW, electronics, propane and other tanks, oil, antifreeze, and additional materials at the direction of the County. The contractor will provide four staff members to support operations.

They will be responsible for all aspects of each HHW event. Including, proper technical identification of waste items, creation of shipping documents, safe control of traffic, off loading of vehicles, waste bulking, waste disposal, site set up and overall event execution.

Vertical Gas Flow Box Economizer



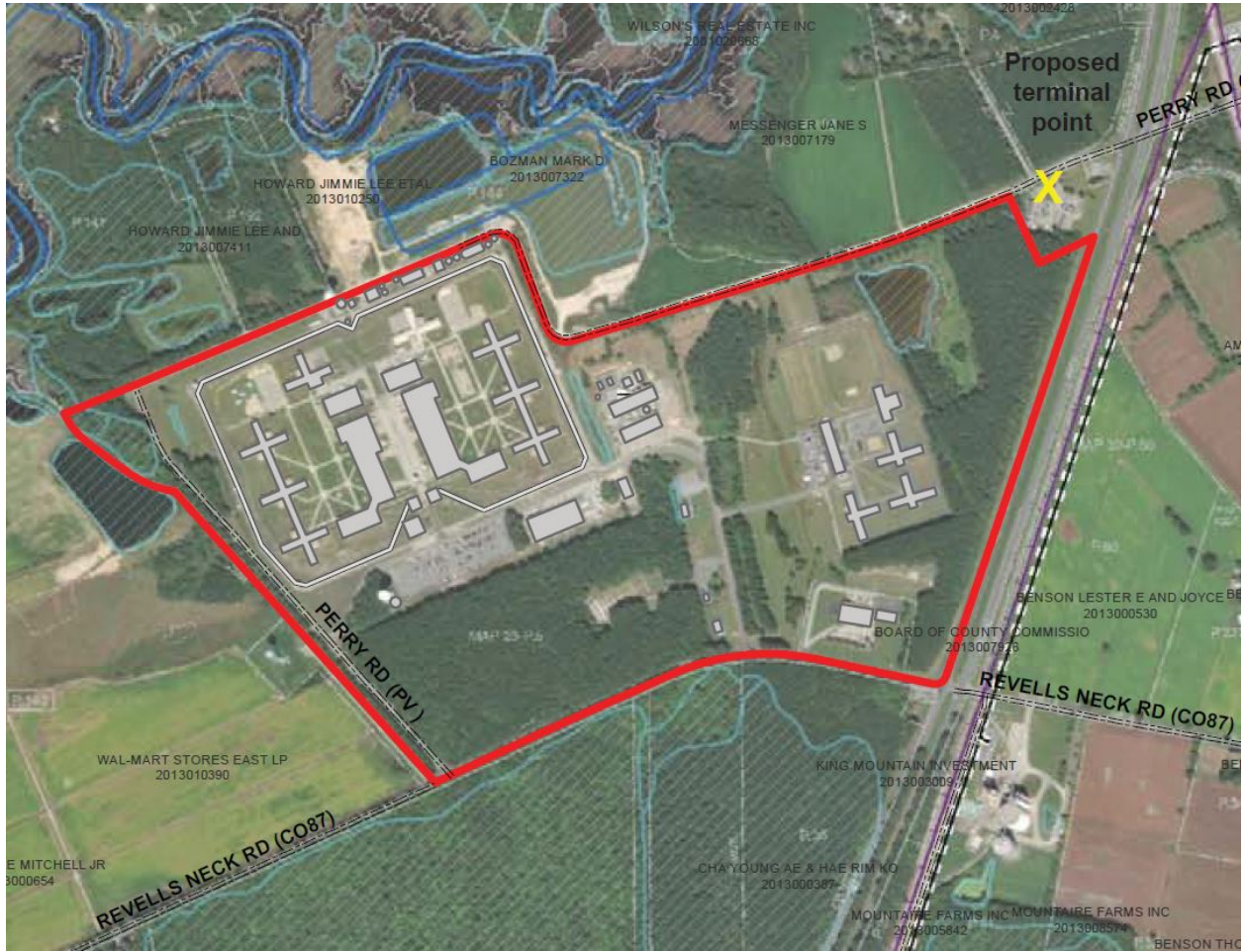

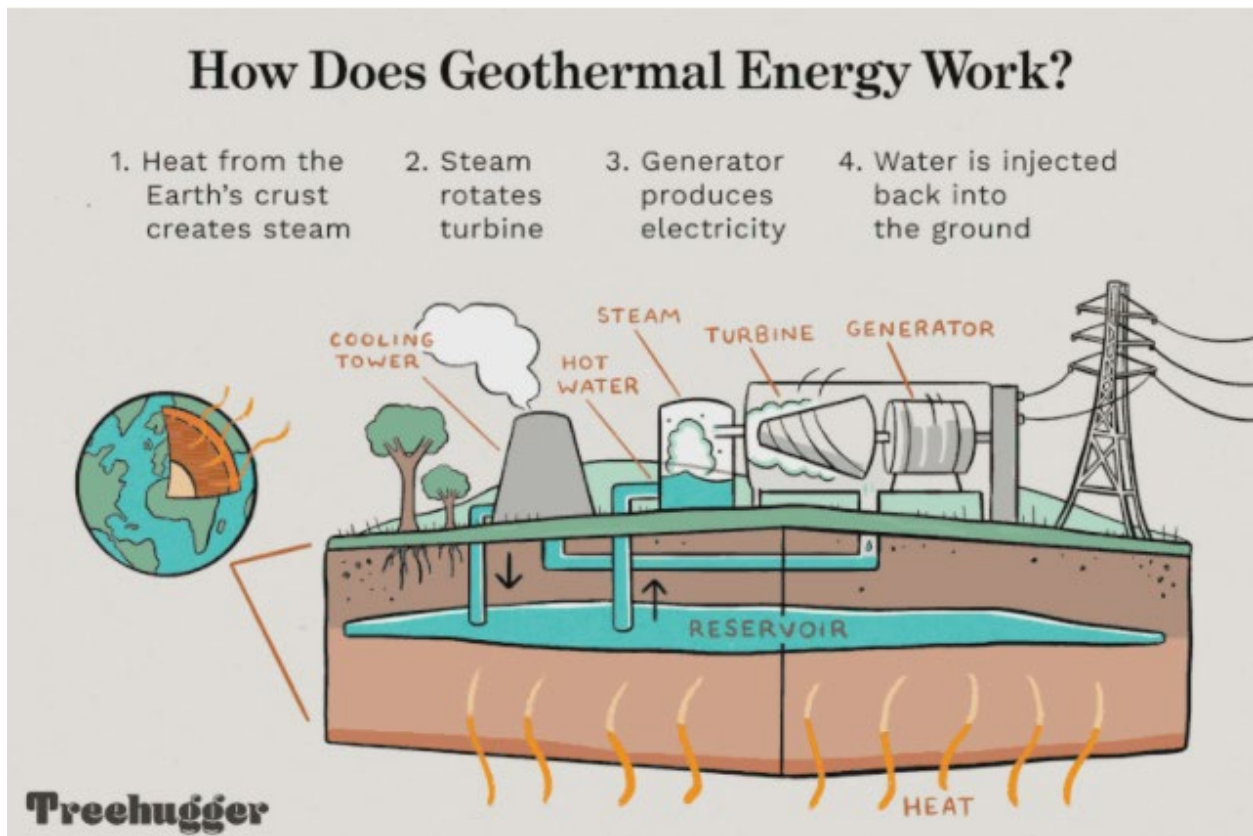

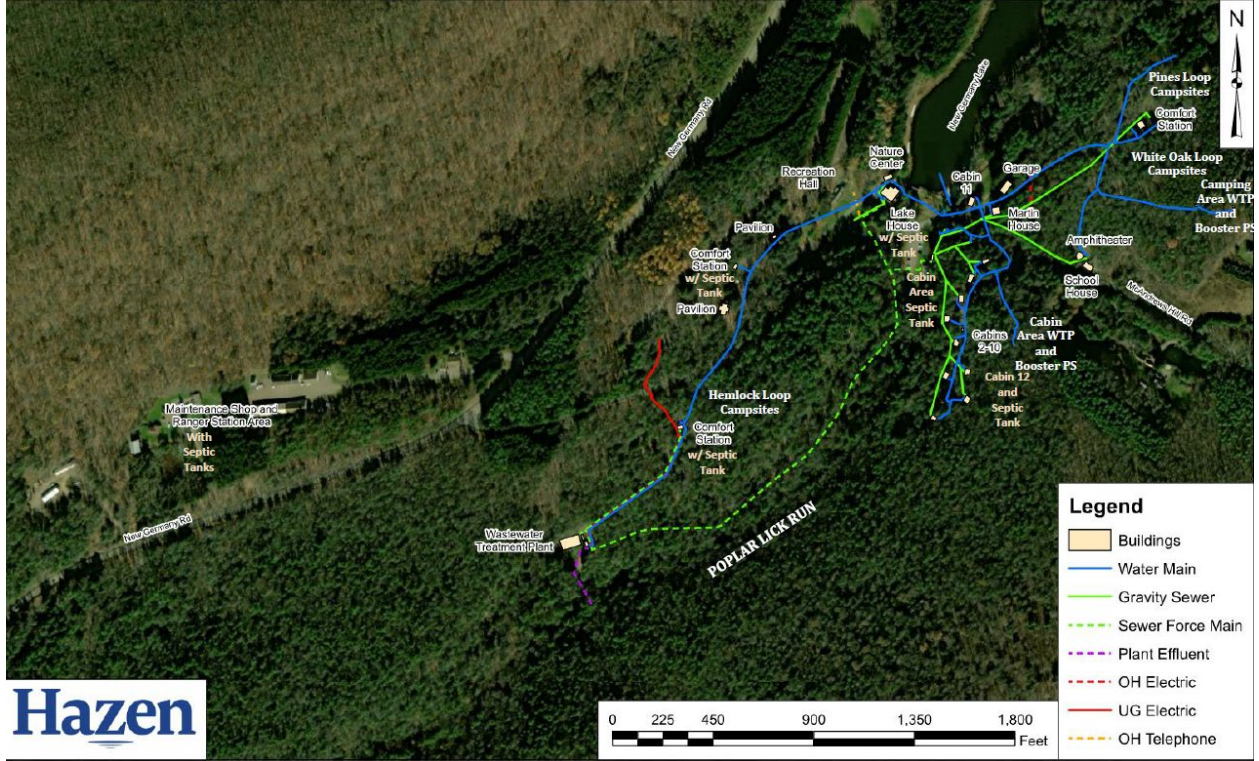
