

Remarks:	The gabion stormwater swale between Cells A-J and N1/N2 at the Harford Waste Disposal Center failed due to the heavy rainstorms this summer. This is the primary swale that runs between the cells at HWDC. The wire metal grid that contained the gabion stone degraded and disintegrated to varying degrees over 1000 feet of swale. The affected swale is no longer functioning as a stormwater control and erosion will continue unabated. This is a severe issue for the landfill and threatens compliance with Harford County and Maryland Department of the Environment permits.

**Remarks:** The Maryland Military Department (MMD) is currently planning an expansion of the Upper Campus within the boundaries of the Camp Fretterd Military Reservation to include a new Marine Corps Reserve Center (MCRC), and Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM) building expansion. The existing wastewater treatment plant cannot accommodate the proposed new facilities at Camp Fretterd and need to be upgraded. Proposed upgrades include the construction of a new equalization tank, expansion of the existing treatment building, process controls, and upgrades to the electrical service.

This project was rebid. The original bids were rejected since all bids were either non-responsive to the published requirements or substantially exceeded budgeted funds. On Auguust 17, 2023, Lee Foundation submitted a bid protest to MES of the award to M2. Lee Foundation's protest is currently being reviewed by the MES Procurement Officer and a decision on the protest will be made soon.

This recommended award is to the OEM to overhaul STG #1 at ECI beginning in or near April 2024.



**Remarks:** Prince George's County opened the HHW lot in 2000 at the Brown Station Rd Sanitary landfill. It is open and free of charge to County residents who need to dispose harmful household waste such as: car batteries, automotive fluids and fuels, electronics, cleaning agents, oil-based paints, household batteries, and solvents among other materials. The HHW lot operates weekly, Thursday to Saturday. The contractor provides staff to support operations and is responsible for the proper handling and disposal of the material stream collected. Services

include technical identification of waste items, creation of shipping documents, safe control of vehicle traffic, off-loading of vehicles, waste bulking, waste disposal, site set up, and overall event execution. During Option Year 1, ACV will continue to provide these services through Fiscal Year 2024.

\* ACV has experienced challenges meeting the MBE participation goal to date. Their original plan included an MBE firm to provide temporary labor, however, per ACV, the MBE experienced labor shortages and failed to supply the amount of labor needed to meet participation goals. Further, ACV indicated a lack of available MBE companies suited to meet the needs of the contracted services and difficult market conditions added to the challenge of incorporating other vendors. As a result, in February 2023, MES notified ACV of non-compliance with MBE requirements and requested corrective actions to comply. ACV submitted a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) incorporating new MBE companies to supply materials, labor, electronics recycling, and equipment rentals. The plan projected MBE participation at 15.5% by December 31, 2023 and 20.4% by December 31, 2024, upon Option Year 1 extension. MES accepted the CAP on March 27, 2023. As of July 21, ACV has indicated new MBE vendors have been incorporated and increased participation is expected to be reflected in the July 2023 invoice to be submitted in August.

MES is recommending exercising Option Year 1 through August 31, 2024 and allow ACV time to improve their participation performance as noted in their CAP. In parallel, MES will prepare to advertise the services for FY25 so there is no gap in service for the County should ACV fail to comply with MBE requirements and the Option Year 2 is not exercised. MES will make the determination to bid in January 2024 based on ACV's MBE participation through December 2023, which is expected to be at 15% by then.

Remarks:	The project consists of the replacement and/or rehabilitation of the water and sanitary sewer system piping network within the park.	

This project will include the upgrading of the accompanying wastewater pump stations. These project upgrades are needed to eliminate problems associated with water main breaks and flooding of pump stations during storm events.

Due to unforeseen soil conditions, much of the soil removed from the trenches is not suitable to be re-utilized as a structural fill material. As a result, proper backfill material needs to be purchased and the unsuitable material removed and disposed of. In addition, this change order proposes directional drilling under a historically significant Confederate Cemetery as opposed to excavating through it. An approximate \$100K reduction in project cost could be realized by elimination of the fee for archaeological monitoring required for the open cut. Also, the unknown nature of open cut through the cemetery could cause extended delays in construction if artifacts were found.

\* The majority of the MBE subcontractor services consists of materials hauling and paving. Due to the sequence of construction most of these services have not been required to date. It is anticipated that the MBE services will be required in the coming months and subsequent payout to the MBEs will align with the 19% goal.
