A RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE ("SERVICE") TO CLOSE CERTAIN OFFICES AND FACILITIES OF THE SERVICE ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 29, 2024, AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING CERTAIN PAYMENTS TO EMPLOYEES OF THE SERVICE.

<u>R E C I T A L S</u>

WHEREAS, pursuant to §3-103.1(b)(4) of the Natural Resources Article,

Annotated Code of Maryland, the Service may determine the terms of employment of its employees, including compensation, benefits, holiday schedules, and leave policies; and

WHEREAS, the employees of the Service are dedicated, resourceful and hard-

working; and

WHEREAS, by law, the offices of most State agencies will be closed on Friday, November 29, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MARYLAND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE THAT:

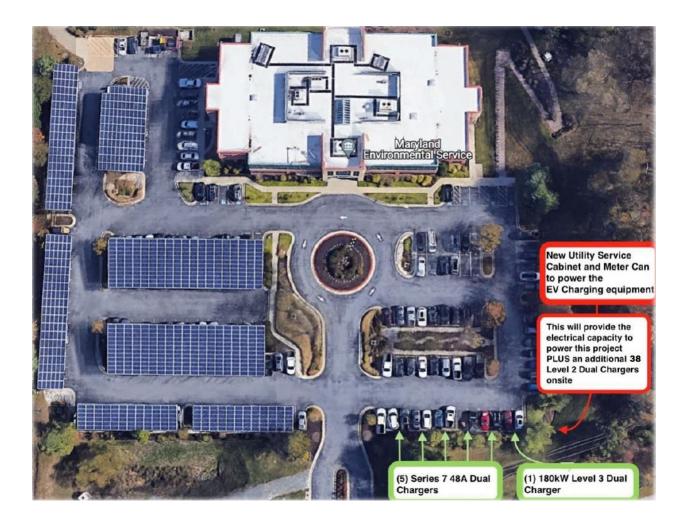

Remarks: This is a design / build project for a new electric vehicle (EV) charging system with six dual-port charging stations that can provide charging for up to 12 EVs. The new electrical infrastructure that will provide electrical power to these new chargers is planned to be sized to support future expansion to an additional 19 dual-port charging stations for a total future capacity to support charging for up to 50 EVs. One of the initial dual-port charging stations will be a direct current fast charger, capable of charging a Ford F-150 Lightning in as little as 20 minutes (from about 20% to 80% battery capacity).

MES is working towards electrification of our fleet of on-road vehicles by installing EV charging stations at our headquarters building. MES' headquarters EV fleet currently includes a Chevy Bolt, Ford Mustang Mach-E, and Ford F-150 Lighting. This project is in support of Maryland's Climate Solutions Now Act to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2045.

The award amount is greater than the proposal amount due to inclusion of the proposal options which extend the maintenance and repair service and contract warranty by 1 year for a total of 3 years.

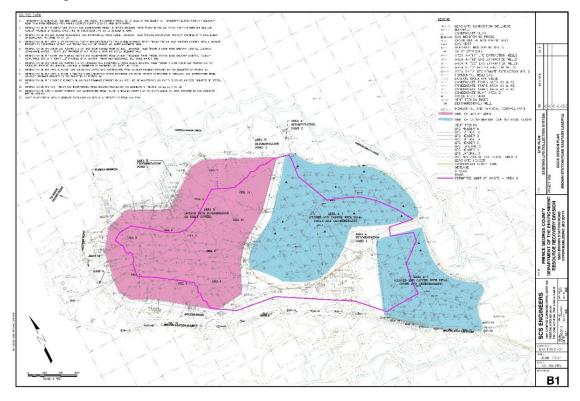

Remarks: Effective June 12, 2023, the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) published its final regulation addressing the control of landfill gas (LFG) methane emissions from municipal solid waste (MSW) landfills in the state (COMAR 26.11.42). The existing GCCS at BSRSL was not originally designed to meet the requirements of the new regulation. In November 2023, MDE approved a compliance plan for BSRSL, which includes upgrades to the existing GCCS to conform with the requirements of COMAR 26.11.42.

Per the approved compliance plan, the AE will design upgrades, obtain permits and create bid ready construction drawings for the existing GCCS. Expected upgrades include installation of additional landfill gas collection wells and piping, new or updated gas destruction flare units, and upgrades to ancillary equipment for the gas moving system. Design and permitting must be

completed by the summer of 2025 so that construction activities can be completed by November 2026 to comply with the regulatory timeline.

Minority Business Enterprise firms will be utilized to perform the geotechnical investigation and surveying, electrical engineering, and landfill gas monitoring and analysis

Remarks: The Water Treatment Plant, which was constructed over 50 years ago, needs important upgrades because the current treatment system has reached the end of its expected life. The project will replace the aging iron removal system and the existing elevated water storage

tank, which is standing on a deteriorated foundation. A new water treatment plant and a 120,000gallon elevated water storage will be constructed under this project. Included in the project are new ion exchange pressure filters, new electrical and control systems, new chemical feed systems, a new lab area, new finished water tank, and high lift pumps to pump potable water to the water tower and distribution system. The building will receive new windows and doors, new HVAC units, and several cosmetic upgrades.

The project was advertised on both eMaryland Marketplace and the MES Bonfire website. Emails were sent to 10 general contractors on the MES bidder's list. Four companies requested bid packages, 4 expressed the intention to bid, 4 actively participated in the pre-bid meeting, and 4 visited the site.

Remarks:

WMS has converted the fuel source for both existing high-pressure boilers from wood chips and No. 2 fuel oil to natural gas and No. 2 fuel oil. At the culmination of their construction efforts, which included modifications to the internal boiler configuration and boiler room, the boiler's original equipment manufacturer (OEM) began start-up testing of the newly installed burners. They found that the induced draft (ID) fan created airflow and draft conditions inside the modified boiler that could not be controlled to allow reliable and repeatable light-off conditions. Following troubleshooting and testing, the OEM and MES' engineering consultant determined that the ID fan must be replaced to finish the start-up testing and advance to full commissioning of the burner. As a result, MES procured two new ID fans under a separate contract.

The monetary value of this change consists mostly of the installation of the new ID fans and extension of rentals. A rental boiler and pair of rental diesel generators are temporarily serving the critical functions of the ECI Cogeneration Plant for the Institution's kitchen, hot water, and electric power backup source needs. The current rental period of the temporary boiler and generators ends September 22 and September 24, respectively. This rental equipment must stay on site for the duration of this work, which is projected to carry through November 2024. Accordingly, this change order extends the rental period by 8 weeks to November 17 and November 19, 2024. Additionally, this change order includes installation of an outdoor access ladder, the function of which was included in the base demolition scope, and a cost credit to MES for unused electrical materials.

Due to the specialized nature of the rental utility equipment, there are limited MBE subcontracting opportunities for this change order.

Estimates of Phragmites Coverage at HMI and Poplar

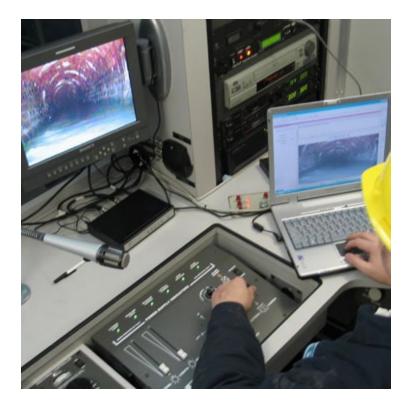
